

2-Year Regular Term Position in Psychology

The School of Arts and Social Science at Grenfell Campus, Memorial University invites applications for a two-year regular term position with the potential for renewal. A specialization in cognition and/or perception, within Psychology's Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science programs at the rank of Assistant Professor. The position will begin on August 1st, 2018.

Along with introductory psychology courses, the applicant must be qualified to teach courses in cognition and perception within the existing psychology program. There is also the potential to supervise senior undergraduate research projects. A Ph.D. or near completion (ABD) is required as is relevant undergraduate teaching experience.

In electronic form, applicants should send a letter of application, curriculum vitae, and a teaching dossier (including evidence of teaching effectiveness and sample course outlines if available). Applicants should also arrange for three letters of reference to be sent electronically to: Dean, School of Arts and Social Science, Grenfell Campus, Memorial University of Newfoundland, sassdean@grenfell.mun.ca. Applications will begin to be reviewed on Friday, March 16th, 2018 and review will continue until the position is filled.

All appointments are subject to budgetary approval. Salary will reflect qualifications and experience in accordance with the Collective Agreement governing faculty at Memorial University of Newfoundland.
